"PERSISTENCE: DON'T GIVE UP!"

The value of persistence in many areas of our lives is evident. One of my **favorite quotes** is from **Calvin Coolidge** stating:

"Nothing in the world can take the place of persistence. Talent will not; nothing is more common than unsuccessful people with talent. Genius will not; unrewarded genius is almost a proverb. Education will not; the world is full of educated derelicts. Persistence and determination alone are omnipotent."

How does this apply to our fishing? The **knowledge and skill** used by successful fishermen **does not come easily.** There are **no "magic lures" or "secrets"** that will **make a person successful in fishing overnight**. Knowledge about fish and experience on the water **using** that **knowledge is the key** to catching fish consistently. Yet **many** people do not understand the significance of the above quote and **feel they do not have the talent, genius, or knowledge** to duplicate the catches of more experienced Spoonpluggers. **Buck Perry** has **created the knowledge we need** with his talent and genius. Reading his lifes' story about how he studied fish behavior leaves no doubt about the **determination and persistence he used to discover the scientific facts**. The knowledge about fish and **a precise and organized manner of lure presentation is there for us to use**. All **we need to have** is **the persistence** and determination **to use it.**

Persistence can grow from realizing the fact that fish are not active most of the time. We cannot expect instant success on the water whenever we go fishing. The knowledge we gain from studying Mr Perrys' written materials helps us to better choose those places, times, and lure presentation methods that will give us the best chance to catch fish under each set of circumstances. By persistently studying and experiencing Spoonplugging Guidelines on the water, we become better and better at evaluating each fishing situation.

Spoonplugging is a lifetime learning experience. There are **no "experts" in fishing** because there is so much more to learn. We are fortunate to have our **newsletters**, **clubs**, **and network outings** where we can **help and learn from each other**. We really **begin to learn when we share and teach others**. With so many different levels of experience, **we all can be teachers of someone**. **Being persistent** in continuing to gain knowledge **is essential in any area of endeavor**. Once we think we **know it all** and stop learning, **we will lose interest** and our fishing success will plummet. A fishing trip where nothing is learned, even though some fish were caught, was considered by Mr Perry to be a waste of time.

Belief that what you are doing "works" is fundamental to being persistent. Don't count on another Spoonplugger "proving" anything by taking you out on a given day. Conditions are just too unpredictable. Attending and seeing the great catches made at our Spoonplugging Network Outings can be very convincing. Also, pictures of big fish in our newsletters and Mr Perrys' written material are very persuasive. And, the simple logic of Spoonplugging speaks for itself. When exposed to these, there is little excuse not to be persistent if one desires to become a successful fisherman.

If there is a "secret" to fishing success, it is the persistence and determination to study and acquire knowledge, then to experience it on the water, that gives us the success and satisfaction we desire.
