## **ROCK BASS, LETTER TO MIDWEST OUTDOORS, 2014**

## **Dear Midwest Outdoors,**

I really enjoyed the <u>article on Rock Bass</u> written by John Bennett in the September 2014 issue of <u>Midwest Outdoors</u>. He gives credit to a <u>species of fish often neglected</u>, but fun to catch and good to eat. In the article he mentioned that an 8 inch fish is a pretty good size, but that they have good sized mouths and <u>attack artificial lures aggressively</u>. Recently I fished a week on <u>Crystal Lake near Traverse City</u>, <u>Michigan</u>. It is a <u>deep</u> (180 feet) and <u>clear</u> (lure visibility in 30 feet) with few weeds, making <u>fishing tough</u>. If your readers are looking for big Rock Bass, this might be the lake. My son-in-law and I <u>caught around 300 rock bass during the week</u> and <u>few</u> of them were <u>under</u> 8 inches. I believe that the major fish species in this lake is Rock Bass because we caught so many. <u>Most</u> were <u>caught trolling artificial lures in 24 to 40 feet of water</u>. Other fish caught at these depths were a few perch and Smallmouth Bass and one pike. The smallmouth were beauties, but not numerous. Mr. Bennett was correct that Rock Bass aggressively attack artificial lures, since the <u>majority</u> of them were <u>caught on #100, #700, and #800 Spoonplugs</u>, even though we were using 3-way rigs with smaller lures. The <u>largest</u> Rock Bass caught was <u>a hefty 13 inch fish</u> that I thought was a smallmouth when first hooked

because it fought so well. I believe <u>this lake could hold some record fish</u> because of its' depth and large size. Attached are pictures of a 12 inch Rock Bass and a couple of nice smallmouth caught by my son-in-law.
