"SALTWATER SPOONPLUGGING IN SARASOTA BAY"

In **February, 2001**, Sandra and I planned a **weeklong vacation to Sarasota, Florida**. I had hoped to do a day or two of fishing. Seeking information, only one name was listed in the area in the more recent Spoonplugging Directories. **Captain Jack Ryan** is a **fishing guide** in Sarasota Bay and surrounding waters. He explained how he **uses Spoonplugs to troll the open saltwater shallows of the bay**. A morning trip was scheduled over the phone.

After arriving in Sarasota, More definitive plans were set up. "Captain Jack" has a **22 foot fiberglass open skiff with a 150 hp motor** and a center console with canopy. A good sized boat and motor is needed as the **bay is very large**. To find **30-40 foot depths out in the Gulf** of Mexico to fish, boats must **go out 8-10 miles** or more. He **uses many approaches** to fishing, including **live bait, fly fishing, deep openwater trolling, casting the bay structures, and trolling Spoonplugs** in the shallow bay. **Sarasota Bay averages 4-6 feet deep**, with **8 feet about max** for most dredged channels. The approaches used are determined by seasonal movements, activity levels of the fish, and customer preferences. **Trolling Spoonplugs in the bay was requested.**

We arrived at CB's Saltwater Outfitters Marina on Siesta Key and met Captain Jack. He has been using Spoonplugs for over 30 years and is very familiar with Buck Perrys' "Green Book". He gives fishing seminars and incorporates Spoonplugging principles into them. He has an excellent reputation for catching fish with other local guides and is known as "that fellow who uses Spoonplugs". His vast knowledge of the seasonal and daily movements of the many species of fishes found in the bay and surrounding waters results from living in and fishing this area all his life.

We began early by trolling 500s' on the dredged channel breaklines of the bay flats. Large humps and bars were pointed out that often had less than a foot of water over them. Most broke from about 3 to 5 feet in the channel. His observation of terrain included points, humps, bars, channel marker buoys, current, "smooth water", and the lighter color of shallow flats. Captain Jacks' boat only draws 1 ½ feet of water. Often he would be trolling in 2 feet of water using a shorter line. His thorough knowledge of the shallow structures of the bay was very evident from the fact that we never once "bottomed out". Although his boat will hold 4 or 5 people, when trolling Spoonplugs, he only uses 2 rods and has the customers hold them. There are scattered areas of moss in the bay, but a lot of the bottom is hard and clean where he tries to get the lures ticking lightly. Water color is mostly clear in the bay, although the dredged channels and canals had some halfway decent color from boat traffic.

Next we trolled down narrow canals with boats and homes on both sides. These averaged 4 feet deep or less and are one of his favorite areas to fish. He would try to troll as close to the moored boats and docks as possible. This is how we picked up most of the fish. Snook, jack crevalle, sheepshead, ladyfish, and snapper were caught going about 3-4 mph with a #500 Spoonplug. Later in the morning we went to a couple of his favorite structures in the bay and anchored and cast them with topwater, crankbaits, jigs, and live bait. Of course, the 2 biggest fish of the morning were caught by my wife Sandra, an 18 inch jack cravelle and a 4 ½ pound sheepshead! Those sheepshead have some set of teeth! If I had to "lip" either a sheepshead or northern pike, I'd pick the pike every time!

When told that **if Mr Perry had to pick only one favorite Spoonplug it would be the #500**, Captain Jack said that **he agrees 100%!!**

Buck Perry talks about fishing different types of waters and species of fish to increase your Spoonplugging knowledge and success at catching fish. This trip certainly opened my eyes to a broader fishing world. To have experienced this fishing situation with such a pleasant and knowledgeable guide as Captain Jack Ryan made it truly memorable.
