Muskegon Outing 2019, Gathering at the Hospitality Tent

The 29th consecutive Muskegon Outing took place at Fishermans' Landing on Muskegon Lake July 10-14, 2019. This year the campground management had instigated new strict campground rules that caused confusion for campers and some confrontations. As a result, we will be looking into a different Muskegon area campground for the 2020 Muskegon Outing. The attendance was down a little, but we still had around 40 people from Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois at the Saturday meal. Mostly largemouth bass to 21 inches and pike were caught, along with channel catfish, white bass, and many big drum up to 20 pounds. Spring, Mona, White, Muskegon, Duck, and Hess Lakes were fished mostly.
