"3-WAY RIGS"




Diagram and rig secured with twistie

Tom Moore discussed and demonstrated the many uses of 3-way rigs. A 3-way swivel is used with a 2 to 1 ratio of long line to dropper. If you fish alone, the longest you should have is 3 feet with an 18 inch dropper because the swivel won't go through the guides when you are netting the fish. 20 to 50 pound mono is used for the rig, depending on the situation. Tom likes to use a plastic grub or floating minnow crankbait on the longer line. If a light flutter spoon or a small Spoonplug is used there, you will have to keep moving forward or it will fall and may foul. The shorter dropper line is where you use the larger Spoonplug or deep-diving crankbait. This is used to pull both lures down to greater depths, up to 50 feet or more with wire line, without lead weights. The river rig is a 3-way rig with lead weight on the dropper due to many snags in most rivers. These rigs can be pre-tied, wound up, and stored with a "twistie" to keep them contained.
