## **LUNKER HUNTER SPOONPLUGGERS MEETING DECEMBER 5, 2013**

## "BLADEBAIT PROGRAM"



Jump lures, 2 bladebaits on bottom of picture, ½ and ¾ ounce

Tom Moore gave us a rundown on "How to Use Bladebaits". He likes to use a spinning rod to get greater distance and cover more area. Lift the rod up 2-3 feet and let the lure sink back on a tight line. He prefers yellow Hi-Vis Power Pro braided line with a fluorocarbon leader, but if the weather is below freezing, use monofilament or fluorocarbon. There is a learning curve to using bladebaits, so if you are not catching fish, modify what you are doing. For color, he likes silver plating because it reflects 90% of available light, wheras nickel only reflects 50%.

Chartruse and glo colors are also good. If a fish can't see it, he won't strike it! Blades can be very effective on schooled fish but remove them quickly and get back down. Many fish are lost by applying too much pressure and pulling the hooks out. Tom recommends testing your rod and reel drag with a weight scale so no more than 2 pounds of pressure can be put on a fish.
