"MORRISON LAKE FISHING REPORT July 31, 2004"



2 nice bass from Morrison Lake

Fished Morrison Lake this morning on one of the better weather conditions yet this year. The last 2 days had been hot and muggy with clouds, and this morning was the same. Buck Perry says that more days of stable weather is better, but in Michigan we take what we can get! I started out trolling a 500 Spoonplug and caught a small bass right away. Using the 400, 250, and 200 did not produce any more **fish**. I inquired of a bass fisherman who informed me that earlier he had caught 10 small bass in the shallows around docks on topwater baits. After trolling by a known structure and not getting a fish, I decided to anchor and cast it. The breakline of the bar was at 10 feet, which broke into 16-18 feet. Anchoring at 9 1\2 feet, I could fan cast out to 18 feet and get a good walk with a 100 Spoonplug all the way back to the boat. I caught 2 nice bass on 3 casts. At that point, the bass **fisherman** I had talked to earlier who was fishing nearby **asked me to help him**, as he had just buried a treble hook into his thumb! I agreed and he came over. He did not have heavy duty wire cutters with him so I got mine out and cut off the hook so he could pull it through (You should always have this tool with you whenever you fish!). He had heard of Spoonplugging but was not familiar with it.

After the thumb was taken care of, I went back to casting. I had a couple more fish to the boat before the bass fisherman worked down the shoreline shallows very far so I asked him if he would like to try casting a Spoonplug. He came over, but could not anchor (did not carry one), so I tied him downwind of my boat and gave him a 100 Spoonplug to try. At first he had a little trouble waiting for the lure to settle to the bottom before he began his retrieve, but got the hang of it after a few casts. I picked up 2 more fish, but then the movement ended. 6 fish were caught with the smallest about 15 inches and the 2 largest 18 and 18 1\2 inches (over 3 pounds). The bass fisherman remembered that Netcraft caries Buck Perrys' book "Spoonplugging", and I recommended that he purchase and study it thoroughly. He commented how nice it was to come across a fisherman who shares his knowledge, and I told him that is what Spoonplugging is all about.

Roger Bouwkamp was fishing Morrison Lake also this morning. Just to confirm what Bucks' book states ("all fish become active at the same time"), Roger got into a school of bass about the same time that I did on a different structure, and caught a number of them up to 3 pounds.
